Students will be able to:

2. Discuss Thomas Jefferson's role with the Declaration of independence.
3. Explain the effects of the war on Loyalist women and children.
4. Discuss the roles of men and women in daily life in the colonies.
5. Describe conditions and challenges for camp followers of American and British armies.
6. Identify objects in the portrait that symbolize Washington's achievements.
7. Describe Washington's role as the nation's first president.
8. Describe the events that occurred during Thomas Jefferson's lifetime.
9. Learn about Jefferson's many inventions.
10. Summarize the range of contributions that Benjamin Franklin made throughout his life.
11. Describe the contributions Ben Franklin made as a printer and writer in colonial America.
12. Explain how the rights of American citizens are protected by the Bill of Rights.
13. Describe the Supreme Court's role in the separation of powers.
14. Describe the responsibilities and powers of Executive, Legislative and Judicial Branch.
15. Explain the differences between local and state governments and the federal government.
16. Trace and explain U.S. settlement patterns and population growth from 1800 to 1820.
17. Discuss the causes of the War of 1812 as well as key battles and events during the war.



DESCRIPTION: Throughout this term, students will learn about United States history and fight for their rights and the development of a democratic government, as well as to know the main characters that help on the resolution of the Constitution, the Bill of Rights and the branches of government.

Students will get to know main causes and reasons of immigration from Europe to United States, and the effects of this. Roles of women during the revolutionary war and the development of women rights through the war. In order to work these content, different strategies such as presentations, projects, videos and online quizzes through Kahoot!, class discussion, and group work will be used to make students able to achieve the objectives set for this units.
